

both in number of elevators and in volume of business. Arrangements were made also to handle livestock shipments, and offices were opened at the Calgary and Edmonton Stock Yards. Implements, lumber, and general commodities, also have been supplied to farmers of the Province by this company.

Since this farmers' company was organized in Alberta it has at all times worked in harmony with The Grain Growers' Grain Co. Ltd. Grain passing through their elevators was turned over to the selling force of The G. G. Co. in the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. Implements and supplies likewise were purchased in conjunction with the same company. In short, the two farmer companies practised co-operation in doing business for the farmers.

It is the union of these two institutions—The Grain Growers' Grain Co. Ltd., and The Alberta Farmers' Co-operative Elevator Co. Ltd.—that brought into reality the new company, **UNITED GRAIN GROWERS LTD.**

It is new in name, greater in size, more able to bring to pass the benefits that always have been the aim of the two companies. But it is not NEW in the strict sense of the word. The good work will go on under the new organization; there will be no hesitation because of a fear of treading on each other's toes—these two farmer companies will not continue to compete one against the other; more
