IRON FRAME CHOPPING MILL.

FOR CHOPPING OATS, PEAS, CORN AND OTHER FEED STUFFS.

The importance of stock feeding and of preparing the feed for them
has, of late years, produced a great variety of Chopping Mills. The above
Cut represents what is now generally conceded to be the best Mill in
the Market. It is mounted on a substantial Iron Frame strongly braced,
which obviates any vibration of the Machine when at work.

The Grain is fed to two fluted rollers, driven at different speeds and
grinding against each other, the feed being regulated by a Thumb-screw,
and the fineness of the meal, being also regulated by Set Screws to suit
the operator.

The Rollers are estimated to last for a length of time, and when worn
dull can be re-cut at a trifling cost. It is fitted with a Fly-wheel, is
driven either by Belt or Rods as may be desired, and is capable of cutting
from 20 to 30 bushels per hour, according to the power used.
