The body of the book consists of a new translation of The Awakening of Faith and The Lotus Scriptures, two classics which are to Buddhism what the New Testament is to Christianity. Introductory and explanatory chapters indicate striking points of contact between Christianity and Buddhism. Incidentally Dr. Richard explodes the theory that Jesus borrowed from Sakyanumi, the founder of Buddhism, by reminding his readers that the school of Buddhism, known as the Mahayana, in which the resemblances to Christian teaching are mainly found, was not extant until the close of the first century of the Christian era. Both the special student of Comparative Religion and the general reader will find Dr. Richard's pages full of interest and instruction. **Christ and Christ's Religion** is a volume of sermons, by F. Homes Dudden, D.D., in the second series of "The Scholar as Preacher" (same publishers, U.C. Tract Society, Toronto, 255 pages, \$1.35). Dr. Dudden is a Fellow of Lincoln College, Oxford, and Examining Chaplain to the Bishop of London. The title of the book was chosen because the discourses in it "deal more or less directly with various aspects of the Person and work of our Lord, or with leading principles of His teaching". Simple and direct in style, full of spiritual suggestion and moving freely in the atmosphere of modern thought and scholarship, these sermons are capital specimens of present-day preaching. **Early Ideals of Righteousness**: Hebrew, Greek and Roman, by Professor R. H. Kennett, D.D., Mrs. Adam, M.A., and Professor H. M. Gwatkin, D.D. (same publishers, U.C. Tract Society, 85 pages, 90c. net), contains three lectures delivered at the Vacation Term for Biblical Students, Girton College, Cambridge, in 1909. The lectures offer a penetrating analysis of the thinking of these three great nations of antiquity concerning the elements that constitute righteousness in character and conduct.

**The Problem of Theology In Modern Life and Thought**, by Andrew Miller, M.A. (Hodder & Stoughton, London, U. C. Tract Society, Toronto, 324 pages, \$1.25 net), is the title given to a series of lectures delivered on the Alexander Robertson Foundation in the University of Glasgow. The lectures aim at showing that Christian doctrine is a formal statement of the implications of Christian experience and that therefore the way out of present difficulties lies in a clearer conception of the function of the church.

Bob, the central figure in, **The Rules of the Game**, by Stewart Edward White (Mussion Book Company, Toronto, 644 pages, illustrated, \$1.25), had been captain of his football team at college. His father was one of the lumber kings of the middle west in the United States. When Bob left college he started in to learn the business of lumbering from the bottom up. The learning took him into the woods and camps, first of Michigan and then of California. In their rough life he found the "rules of the game" still applied. The story deals trenchantly with attempted big steals of timber and water power, also with the question of forest ranging.
