RESOLVED, That this House doth approve the Clerk's recommendation of William Green, Elquire, to be the English Translator to this House.

Mr. Stuart moved to resolve, seconded by Mr. Lee, that this House doth not approve the recommendation of a Substitute to Mr. Fremont, as proposed in the Letter from the Clerk of this House.

The House divided on the question:

Yeas 13 Nays 2

So it was carried in the affirmative, and

RESOLVED accordingly.

Mr Stuart moved to resolve, seconded by Mr. Borgia, on the recommendation of the Clerk of this House, that Jean Autoine Bouthillier do discharge the duties of French Translator to this House, temporarily, in the place of Charles Frémont, Esquire, until the further Order of this House; and to be paid under the order of this House; and that any payment to Mr. Frémont, as French Translator be suspended, till the further order of this House.

The House divided on the question:

Yeas 10 Nays 5

So it was carried in the affirmative, and

RESOLVED accordingly.

Mr. Speaker communicated to the House a report received by him from the Clerk, of the present State of the Library, purluant to a standing order of the 10th March, 1802.

On
