RAILWAYMAN RAN AMOK IN WINNIPEG

Wounded Two Officials With Revolver and Then Suicided

By Courier Leased Wire. Winnipeg, March 29.—Running amuck and brandishing a .38 calibre revolver, at a meeting of Lodge No. 223, Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, in Travellers' Building last night, Anton Lofy, 823 Dufferin Avenue, wounded E. H. Cooke, of Moosejau and William R. Todd, of Winnipeg, officers of the organization, and afterwards committed suicide.

It appears that during the meeting Lofy had attempted to air an old grievance, the result of his having been discharged from the service of the C. P. R. as a brakeman in October, 1915, for fighting on duty.
