GRIM REAPER BUSY AT SIMCOE AGAIN

Another of the Old Guard Passes in the Person of Andrew Irwin AGED NINETY YEARS

Simcoe, May 9.—(From Our Own Correspondent).—Andrew Irwin died suddenly yesterday at one o'clock at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Chas. Crosbie, Water street, and at the ripe age of ninety years. Deceased had been somewhat indisposed all winter, but was able to be about most of the time, and the end came suddenly while he was out in the yard for a few minutes. Years ago Andrew Irwin ran a cooperage in Bleisheim. He owned a sawmill at Nixon, but it was the Simcoe cooperage which he last operated, and which was taken over by the present manager, Mr. Chas. Crosbie. He was twice married, and his second wife predeceased him some 22 years. Mrs. Robert Sheppard of Waterford, Thos. Musson of Walsh, and James Musson of Windsor are all members of his family. Interment will take place on Sunday.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST VON HINDENBURG IS BEING WAGED

Supporters of Von Moltke Seek to Undermine the Commander-in-Chief

CONFLICT OF OPINION

By Courier Leased Wire London, May 8.—Former influential officers in the German army supporters of General von Moltke, the former chief of staff, are agitating against Field Marshal von Hindenburg on the ground that the German successes on the western front have not reached expectations, according to reports in The Hague, which are under reserve by the correspondent of The Daily Mail. Another report, which, according to the correspondent, appears to have some foundation, is that a sharp conflict of opinion has arisen between Field Marshal Hindenburg, General Ludendorff and the Crown Prince on one side and Chancellor von Hertling and Foreign Secretary von Seeemann on the other. The latter is said to have inclined to von Hertling's side, although hesitatingly.

FINNISH RULER

Amsterdam, May 8.—In confirming reports that negotiations are in progress for Duke Adolph Frederick of Mecklenburg-Schwerin to accept the Finnish crown, the Rheinische Zeitung of Essen, says the relation between Germany and Finland are likely to be of military and economic nature. It is the desire of the Berlin Government, it adds, for a relationship similar to that existing between Germany and Turkey and Bulgaria, except that economic relations with Finland would be closer.

HIGH TREASON

Amsterdam, May 8.—Twelve Dresden members of the Independent Socialist party of Germany have been convicted of high treason by the imperial court at Leipzig, a dispatch from that city to The Vorwarts of Berlin reports. They distributed pamphlets last year advocating the overthrow of the German Empire and helped to bring about the strikes of last summer, advocating them as a means of obtaining peace. They were sentenced to terms varying from 18 months to eight years penal servitude.

FOOD SMUGGLING

Amsterdam, May 8.—Before the Reichstag food committee last week Socialist Deputy Hease, according to German newspapers, demanded that the war office deal with the "scandal" of food smuggling from the front. He said a soldier could no longer obtain leave unless he "dragged home with him parcels from officers containing food for their families." The deputy said it was difficult to say whether the people would tolerate the seemingly inevitable reduction of the bread ration due to delay in the arrival of grain from the Ukraine.

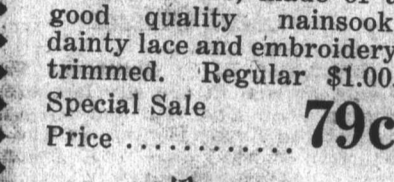

CALL TO COLORS

By Courier Leased Wire Ottawa, May 8.—The proclamation was published here to-day calling up for military service, men of 19 years of age who are unmarried or widowers without children. The men are required to register on or before June 1. They won't be called to active service before July 1.

To save time in getting out special forces, the method of registration will differ from that adopted when the first class was called out on Oct. 15 last. Then a man in the class called out filled one of two forms.

Either he reported for service or he claimed exemption. In the present case, however, the man is required merely to forward by registered post to the registrar under the military service act his name in full, the date of his birth, his place of residence and his usual post office address. When the actual call to the colors comes, the man summoned will be notified by registered post to report for duty.
