Prayer for his ecovery was offered at the services n St. Paul's on recent Sundays. Dean Farrar is now 70 years old, He was ordained deacon in 1854 by the Bishop of Salisbury and three

1871 he was one of the masters Harrow, and for five years thereafter was head master of Marlborough College, a position he held with great distinction. Among his other offices was that of honorary chaplain to the Queen and chaplain in ordinary. In 1883 he was appointed and chaplain in archdeacon of Westminster, and in 1895 he was given his present office in the church. Dean Farrar has written voluminously upon religious and philosophical topics, but his fame will rest upon his "Life of Christ," which was published in 1874.
