The Magazine of Commerce contains an illustrated article entitled "The Romance of the Sign of Old London." The interesting history of these quaint mementoes of bygone days is written by Mr. Collord. When once the system of signs (writes Mr. Colford) as distinctive trading marks gained full headway each tradesman tried to outdo his neighbor in the size and glory of his particular advertisement, until the city became one vast display of decorative humor. Later on, by permission of Charles I., every house mission of Charles I., every hous had its sign hanging from woode brackets or iron rods fixed into the walls of the house. The streets of ol London were narrow, winding chark. The houses projected as throse above the highway until on could almost shake hands with could almost shake hands with neighbor across the street. This narrow places were filled with lon armed signs, ponderous in the weight of iron, ridiculous in conce, tion and fantastic in their dress opaint. In storm and wind the groaned and twisted on their rustinges, hindering ventilation, making the night hideous, and becoming an absolute menace to the travels on the street.
