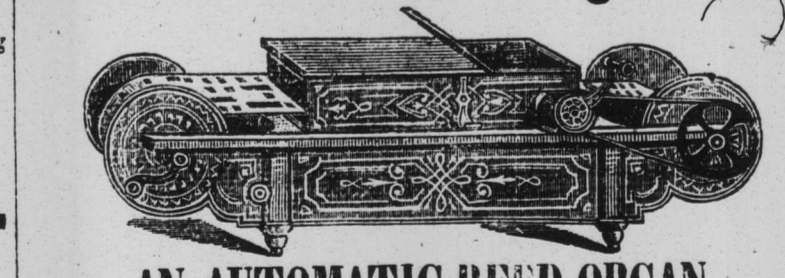

### THE IRISH SITUATION

A new era of Fenian seems to have been inaugurated in England. The latest is that a number of men have been detailed to destroy buildings in various parts of Liverpool are calculated to do immeasurable injury cause.
