Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

A person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, or intending homesteader.

After six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may not acquire more than one quarter section of land. At least 80 acres of the land must be occupied by him or by his wife, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In each district a homesteader, in addition to the land, may pre-empt a quarter section of land along his homestead. The homesteader must reside upon the land and on pre-emption six months of each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn (homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3 per acre. Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

## NEW INDUSTRY FOR CANADA

Manufacture of Textile from Flax Straw Proposed—Ontario Product Equals that of Russia for Purpose

Ottawa, May 24.—The census branch of the trade and commerce department has issued a statement indicating big future for the proposed manufacture of textiles from flax straw in Canada. The report quotes W. J. Robinson, a Chicago expert, and says that under a new chemical treatment flax grown in Ontario produces a fibre which was manufactured in Irish mills into yarns and cloth and found to be as good as the best Russian flax, being capable of manufacture into linen napkins, tablecloths, underwear and other fabrics. The Irish millers are now said to be looking to Canada for this fibre, and to be willing to erect mills in this country.

Canada is now dependent upon the southern United States for all vegetable fibre textiles. In 1911 Canada grew 1,500,000 tons of flax straw capable of yielding 300,000 tons of commercially spinnable fibre which at last year's Canadian prices would have meant sixty million dollars in Canadian exports.

## Prince of Wales Near His Majority

The Prince of Wales will reach his legal majority on June 23, when he will have his own special household and large suites suitably appointed and set apart at Buckingham and Windsor Palaces. Queen Mary will personally superintend the furnishing and decorations of these palaces. The King will continue to supervise the occupations and pursuits of the boy, but the Prince will have a governor and comptroller of the household, an equerry, and two staff secretaries, as well as a large staff of servants at special wages, and coachmen and grooms.

The Prince of Wales will not sever himself from his affectionate family life, but will be able to entertain his friends at luncheons and dinners in his own apartments. He will receive his invitations direct and not through the King. The regency of the Queen is created in the event of the prolonged absence or illness of the Prince of Wales. This would be the situation on June 23, when the Prince of Wales would legally be able to take the King's position in an emergency.

The King's fourth son, Prince George, went to his first school last week. He accompanied his brother, Prince Henry, to the private school at Brooklands, where the latter has been for nearly three years, greatly to the benefit of his health, which, combined with his highly nervous temperament, caused a good deal of anxiety to his parents some time ago.

The Princess Mary, following the example of her aunt, Princess Victoria, keeps copies of a diary. She has been observed making entries in a blue-covered volume at the Royal Academy, especially before the Royal pictures.

## VANCOUVER LABOR MEN ACQUITTED

Charge of Unlawful Assembly Failed.—It Was the Police Who Caused the Disturbance.

Vancouver, B. C., May 29.—A jury to-night returned a verdict of acquittal in the case against labor leader, R. P. Pettipiece and six others, charged with unlawful assembly on public grounds last January, during free speech agitation. The other six discharged were: Walter Read, William Herne, James H. Fisher, Wm. H. Coombs, Charles Lester and Wm. McDowell.

The defence was that the meeting had been called to hear the results of an interview which Pettipiece and other labor leaders had had with the members of the provincial government regarding providing work for unemployed at that time, and that the meeting was privileged and orderly until the police interfered. Several witnesses corroborated Pettipiece. The jury was out three hours.

There were, says the Winnipeg Voice of May 31st ult., between twenty and thirty arrests effected by the police. The majority of the men elected to take speedy trial and were sent up for three months by the judge. The others insisted on a jury trial, and the jury decided that it was not the Socialists or Laborites but the police who caused the disturbance.
