

ZELAYA FLEES FOR MEXICO

Zelaya Accused of Robbery. Managua, Dec. 27.—Though ex-President Zelaya has effected his escape to Mexico plans are now under way to bring him back on a criminal charge in connection with the looting of the Nicaraguan treasury.

Counto, Nicaragua, Dec. 26.—Mexico notified the United States that she was going to take the ex-president away from Nicaragua. No protest was made on his behalf.

As the Mexican minister went on board the flag ship fired the prescribed salute of 13 guns and raised the Mexican flag for her forepeak according to naval etiquette.

As that action of Mexico simplified the position of the government at Washington Admiral Kimball interposed no objections.
