Much evidence has lately been a luced to show that gas is more useful than the electric light in promoting efcient ventilation of air. It is for this ing frequently substituted for the elec-tric light. The latest example is, perhaps, the Society of Medical Officers of Health, which has recently installed gas on its premises, after experience with the electric light.-Dr. Jamieson
