

4307. Linen and checked stripes are combined in this model. It could have wool Jersey with plain checked taffeta or wools for contrast. Braid and embroidery tag, pleasing for decoration.

The pattern is cut in 7 sizes: 36, 38, 40, 42, 44 and 46 inches measure. A 38 inch size requires 4 1/2 yards of 40 inch material. Trim as illustrated requires 1/2 yard of contrasting material. SIMPLICITY AND GOOD DESIGN COMBINED.



4305. Here is a model that is attractive, features, and is well proportioned. Figured and plain crepe, or the same combination of voile or foulard, or linen and plain ham could be used for this style.

The pattern is cut in 3 sizes: 18 and 20 years. To make this style for an 18 year size will require 3 1/2 yards of 32 inch material. The waist at the foot is 2 1/2 yards. To make the waist and sleeves of contrasting material requires 2 1/2 yards of 32 inch wide.

Household Notes.

A small left-over of rice or macaroni can be used to line ramekins which minced meat and tomato can be baked.

To plant fine seed, put in a rather large salt shaker or talcum can with perforated top. By using this the seeds will be sown evenly.

An inexpensive birthday cake can be made by decorating an ordinary white icing cake with firm cream jelly cut into thin strips.

If milkweed is cut before the leaves are untraced it is almost as delicious as asparagus, and can be prepared in about the same way.
