RUSSIAN JAILS ARE GREATLY OVERCROWDED

Moscow, April 29.-A medical report on conditions in the prison at Platzgora, the chief penal establishment in Caucasia, discloses a shocking condition of life. The commission of enquiry was presided over by Dr. Dmitriehov, inspector of the Caucasia mineral springs, and contained a number of army doctors. They visited the prison in consequence of complaints from local health committee that disease was spread from it in the surrounding country.

RUSSIAN JAILS ARE GREATLY OVERCROWDED

The commissioners found that in one chamber of the prison marked to accommodate nineteen men there were forty-six occupants; in another marked for sixteen men there were forty-one occupants. In yet another, which was an underground cellar seven feet high, there were thirty-nine human beings huddled together much as in the Black Hole of Calcutta. One place had once been the oven of a military bakery, and was not meant for human habitation. There had been cases of death from suffocation through impossibility to breathe air.

RUSSIAN JAILS ARE GREATLY OVERCROWDED

Only half an hour daily of outdoor exercise was allowed the inmates of the dirty, dark, verminous rooms, which were so overcrowded that the men could not even stretch their limbs on the cold floor. Eruptive typhus had infected all the prisoners. Several had become tubercular since entering the prison.
