Saw the Sca Serpent.

ToleDo, O., July 17.—Early Wednesday morning, while the schooner Madeline Downing, on her way from Buffalo to this city, was passing the Dunning, about 150 miles east of here in Lake Ere, Capt. Patrick Woods saw, about half a mile ahead, the waters of the lake lashed into a foam. Drawing near, to the surprise of all on beard, a huge sea serpent, wrestling about in the waters as if fighting with an unseen enemy, was seen. 
