Father, Mother and All the Little Tots To Be Deported.

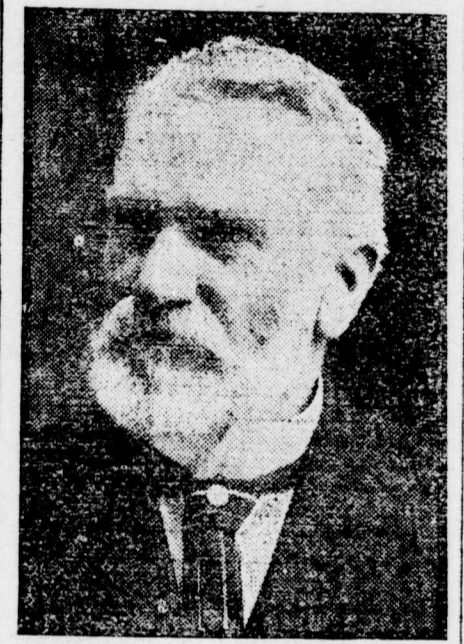

Duty on Power

It is no less than obtaining authority from Parliament to impose an export duty upon electrical energy, and to forbid any company from exporting power without a license, to be granted in accordance with regulations to be prescribed by the governor-in-council.
