LONDON, Sept. 17.—Since Friday the British have advanced along a front of six miles to a depth of from one to two miles.

Seventeen hundred additional prisoners were taken Saturday. The total number captured in the last two days is more than 4,000.

Saturday night gains were made on a front of more than a mile and a half. In this was included the strongly-fortified Danube trench, about a mile long, which has been a barrier to the British advance at Thiepval. Additional territory on a thousand-yard front near Courcelette was captured.

At Mouquet farm the British finally took the fortification for which the opposing armies have been contending for weeks.

Quantities of war material and numerous additional prisoners were captured. Today powerful counter-attacks were launched by the
