SHOOTS UP COURT KILLING 2 WOMEN

Worries Over High Cost of Legal Machinery Leads To Tragedy.

LAWYER WOUNDED

Buffalo, Oct. 16.—Obsessed with the idea that his estate was being dissipated by court costs, Martin L. Warren, a retired farmer, today opened fire with two revolvers at a referee's hearing, killing Mrs. Anna Pilecki, his mother-in-law, and her daughter, Sophie, and wounding Irving Templeton, a lawyer. Four other prominent lawyers, the referee, a girl stenographer and Stephen Warren, the slayer's brother, escaped the bullets, at least ten of which were fired. Warren made no attempt to escape, surrendering without a struggle when two policemen rushed into the office with drawn revolvers. Warren is 53 years old and has been living apart from his wife for several years. He was in the state insane asylum for several months of his wife said, and was released about eleven months ago. Mrs. Warren told the police that her husband became violent during the progress of the hearing. When he began to rave about the loss of his estate, she became frightened and left the room. His face, she said, bore an expression such as she saw on a few years ago when he attempted to kill her with a knife. Mrs. Warren had reached an outer office when the firing began.

MONTREAL EXPECTS ROYAL VISITOR SUNDAY

Prince Will Visit City For Three Days Before Going To Boston.

Montreal, Oct. 16.—The Prince of Wales is expected to arrive at Bonaventure station here about 7 o'clock Sunday evening, and to remain in Montreal until Wednesday, when he will leave for Hamilton, Mass., where he will be the guest of B. Tuckerman, and will hunt with the Myopia club. Following his arrival, the prince will be the guest of honor at a stag dinner given by Sir Henry Thornton at the Mount Royal club, and from there will attend a reception to be given by Madame L. H. Hubert for her daughter Marguerite at the home of Mrs. C. R. Hosmer, Drummond street. At noon on Monday the prince will meet the members of the Montreal hunt club at St. Augustine. It is understood that at Hamilton, Mass., his royal highness will hunt Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, and will leave there on Friday to sail that evening from New York for home.

FIG JELLY.

Cover the bottom of a preserving kettle with cold water, add two quarts of sliced fresh figs and three sliced lemons; place over a slow fire and cook slowly for one hour; strain off the juice through a jelly bag and measure; place the juice in a preserving kettle, add three-quarters of a cupful of dry granulated sugar for each cup of juice and boil twenty minutes or until a little will jelly when dropped on a cold plate. Place in clean glasses, cool, cover tight and store in a cool, dark place.

LAMB CROQUETTES.

Run through the meat chopper two cupfuls of cold cooked lamb freed of all bone, skin, gristle and fat. Heat one tablespoonful of butter in a frying pan, add the chopped lamb and stir and cook until the butter is absorbed. Melt four and a half tablespoonfuls of butter in a saucepan, add four and a half tablespoonfuls of sifted flour, stir and cook two minutes, beat in a scant cupful of milk, a seasoning of pepper, salt, a quarter of a teaspoonful of thyme, one teaspoonful of onion juice and two teaspoons of chopped parsley; stir and cook ten minutes, add the meat, mix well, pour onto a cold plate and when cold divide into even-sized balls the size of an egg; flatten into cutlets, roll in cracker meal, dip in beaten egg, roll in sifted bread crumbs and fry a nice brown in deep, hot vegetable shortening. Serve with tomato sauce and garnish with branches of parsley.

APRICOT SOUFFLE.

Line the bottom and sides of a two-quart pudding mold with split lady fingers after buttering it well. Beat half a cupful of butter to a cream, beat into it half a cupful of sugar, and beat until white and smooth; all yolks of four eggs, one after the addition of each yolk; beat in two-thirds of a cupful of sifted cornstarch and two-thirds of a cupful of apricot pulp that has been pressed through a sieve; mix well, add the stiffly beaten whites of four eggs, and pour one-quarter of it into the pudding mold, cover with a layer of split lady fingers, add another quarter of the mixture, and continue this process until all are used. Set the mold in a large pan of boiling water and boil in the oven thirty minutes. Unmold on a hot platter, and pour over it apricot pulp that has been pressed through a sieve.

BABY MACKEREL, BOSTON.

Split and clean six small fresh mackerel; remove heads and tails, place in a buttered baking pan, sprinkle with salt and paprika, pour into the pan one and a half cupfuls of thin cream and bake in a hot oven twenty minutes. Carefully lift out the fish onto a hot platter, and garnish with lemon slices and sprigs of parsley.

PRESBYTERIANS URGE SUPPORT FOR O. T. A.

Synod of Montreal and Ottawa Calls For Energetic Fight.

Van Kleek Hill, Ont., Oct. 16.—A resolution supporting the Ontario temperance act, and urging the people of Ontario to "exert every energy in the coming plebiscite" to sustain the act was adopted at the Presbyterian synod of Montreal and Ottawa here today. A second resolution condemning the reported withholding of missionary contributions from the church because of the church's decision to enter the union with the Methodist and Congregational churches was also passed by the synod without opposition.
