# Tahkeena Not A New Discovery

Stranded Prospectors Camped There in the Winter of 1897.

Located Good Ground But Did Not Have Supply of Provisions.



McKay is authority for the statement that the big strike on the Tankeena 11,er, normwest of White Horse, is no new find "That placer Horse, is no new find "That placer ground was prospected and proved by a Mr. Moore, of Boston, who, with two companions, wintered on the shores of Klukwan lake, in 1897," said Mr. Mc-Kay, who has been over every foot of the trail-by which entrance to the new district can be made.

"Early in the spring of 1893," he continued, "I went in from Plymouth harbor over the Dalton trail-with a pack train of thirty-three horses. J. J. Mc-Aorthur, government surveyor, and Mr.


