

The sale of the 27th of February, 1917, brought \$377.37. In this amount is included the sum of \$127.00 being the result of the raffle of a little pig purchased from the Ottawa Experimental Farm. The little pig brought a good price and drew a large crowd.

The Ladies of New Carlisle who have always generously contributed such lovely cakes, etc. will be pleased to know that the refreshments brought the sum of \$50.00.

The Girls of the Khaki Club contributed largely to make the sale a success. They helped in the selling, their smiling faces, captivating ways and sweet quaker bonnets brought forth many an unsuspected green back.

At a meeting held on the 5th of March, 1917, it was decided that the \$431.85 now on hand would be immediately disposed of as follows:

To be sent to Mrs. Buckland, wife of the Rev. A. W. Buckland, both of whom are now on active service, to be spent in general hospital work for our wounded boys, \$100.00

To be sent to the Head Office of the Red Cross Society, Quebec, for general hospital purposes, 60.00

For a New Carlisle bed in one of the Canadian Hospitals, 50.00

For the Prisoners of War, 60.00

The balance of \$131.85 will be spent
