Miss Violet Asquith, elder daughter of the Prime Minister, made an interesting speech on social reform in connection with the Wesley House, in connection with the West London Mission, in Kingston.

She said the might compare opening of the Institute to the completion in time of war of a new Dreadnought—a tremendous power for good. In her inspection of the building she had found accommodation for human beings of all ages and both sexes. There was a crèche for babies, a dark room for photographers, a gymnasium for those who desired to use their arms and legs, a number of rooms for study, and a roof garden for those in search of fresh air and peace. To some of them the opening of this Institute was the realization of a hope only cherished by the late Rev. John Price Hughes. It was one fragment of his dream for the reconstruction of society on a religious basis. According to some people the State is now embarked on meddling with the private lives of the people, but her putting it was that it was a good of great social reform. 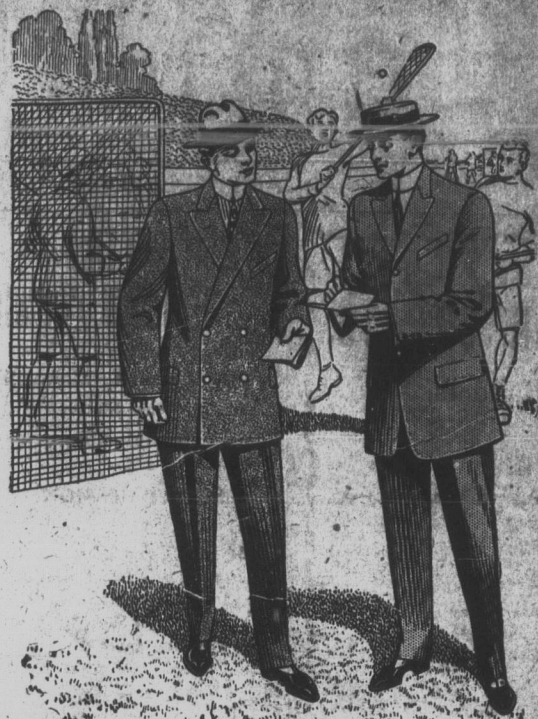
