**NEW COMPANY**  
Indications that the black fox industry is spreading rapidly are coming from all over the province, and especially from Gaspe. A company to be called the "Silver Black Fox Company" with a capital of \$49,000 common stock, is in process of formation and will apply for incorporation shortly. Several pairs of foxes have been purchased from the Dalhousie Prince Edward Island, at high figure. The cultivation of red foxes is also becoming popular, and there has been a remarkable rise in prices during the past few years, skins being four or five times the prices that they were formerly, and the price of six-ck per pair being as high as \$20 to \$30. Breaking away by himself Fraser skated the length of the rink and after dodging all opponents scored a great goal with a hard oblique shot.

McLatchey then went off for a two minute penalty for unintentional tripping, and in a melee in front of goal Fredericton scored.

Although hard and fast it was the cleanest game of hockey ever witnessed here, and at this stage it looked as if Fredericton would sweep, everything before them.

The soft ice was playing havoc with the Vics combinations, and the defense were having a hard time, but putting up a good game. Fredericton scored an offside goal which was chalked off.

The last goal of the game and third for Fredericton was gifted to them, Mowat having the misfortune to put through his own goal.

In turning to send the puck behind it slipped round his stick and went into the corner of the net.

With only a few minutes to go, the Vics woke up, but past Titus they could not get the game ending in Fredericton half with McLatchey saying a shot by throwing the puck into the net.

A splendid game ended, Victorias, 4; Fredericton, 3.  
After the game the teams and friends were entertained to supper in Walter H. Gray's restaurant, which was greatly enjoyed and generously appreciated by all. 
