South Africa to Celebrate

Arrival of Chapman, Which Carried the First Settlers

SOUTH AFRICA has its Maydower, the little ship Chapman, the first of a fleet of sailing ships which a hundred years ago brought to its shores a body of British settlers who left an enduring mark on the country. It is coincidence that in the very year in which America will be celebrating the tercentenary of the arrival of the Pilgrim Fathers on the Mayflower, South Africa is celebrating the centenary of the arrival of British settlers, or, as they are commonly called, the 1820 settlers. At that time the Cape had been under British rule less than a quarter of a century, and was occupied almost entirely by Dutch speaking settlers, who had mostly settled in the western districts owing to the distress and economic pressure resulting from the Napoleonic wars.

The British Government decided to promote the settlement of the eastern province. On this project they were prepared to expend the sum of £20,000. The scheme was eagerly taken up, and out of a large number of applications some 4,000 men, women and children were selected, not never has so small an expedition been so successful. The settlers proved to be of the true pioneer spirit, and their descendants, who were equipped with the most modern tools and machinery, and (with some honorable exceptions) with the most modern tools and machinery, and (with some honorable exceptions) with the most modern tools and machinery.

The first batch landed on April 10, 1820, at Port Elizabeth, then a barren, desolate, and almost uninhabited strip of land on the eastern coast of the Cape. The whole of the eastern province, one of the richest and most fertile of South Africa, and dotted with many busy towns, villages and thriving farms.

At the suggestion of the Prime Minister, Gen. Smuts, the special celebration of the centenary has been postponed till next year, owing to the abnormal conditions caused by the war and the difficulty of making suitable arrangements. The hope is also expressed that next year the Prince of Wales will be present, which would undoubtedly add much to the success of the celebration.

The chief centre of the event will be Grahamstown, a small but flourishing town in the eastern province, which a hundred years ago was the centre of the activities of the settlers, and where this year local celebration is being held by the Wesleyan Church, which played a very prominent part in the religious and social life of the early settlers.

South Africa has as much reason to be proud of the 1820 Settlers as America has of the Pilgrim Fathers. Though the cause of the exile was different, the spirit of indomitable courage and love of liberty were the same.

The coming year will mark the semi-centennial of the opening of the women's college of the University of Wisconsin.
