A motion was argued before Justice Osler for an order declaring that the bail bond given by Mr. Gordon Robson, Whitby, on behalf of the jewellery thief Gautheraux, may be declared void, and that the bail may not be estreated as ordered by the court, on the ground of irregularities in the document. Mr. Bigelow appeared on behalf of Mr. Robson, and Mr. Fenton for the crown. Judgment reserved.

A decision of some importance to practi-

A decision of some importance to practitioners in chambers was given by Mr. Justice Proudfoot. Under the old practice of the court it was necessary that an order should be issued by the referee in chambers before it was appealable. Under the judicature act, however, his lordship holds that the issue of the order is not actually necessary before the appeal can be brought. He allowed an application extending the time for appealing in a case in which the above question came up. above question came up.

Judgment was given in the chancery division in the case of Harvey v. the Great Western railway, dismissing the appeal from the master with costs. The motion before the master was to strike out the Great Western railway as defendants to an action, on the ground that the damage caused to certain goods was committed by the Grand Trunk railway company, and that the plaintiff's only redress was against the Grand Trunk railway company, and that the plaintiff's only redress was against them. Also that the defendant had joined the two companies as co-defendants in the action without knowing which were liable, and he should be obliged to elect which of the two he was seeking damages from. The master dismissed the motion and allowed the plaintiff to bring both companies before the court. On appeal to a judge, his ruling was confirmed. 




