

THE FEMALE EXODUS.

Mr. Patten has been issued by the Registrar of the Supreme Court of Ontario a writ of habeas corpus in connection with the project for the emigration of the surplus female population of Ontario to Manitoba. From the circular it is learned that the editor of the Woodstock Journal goes into the project as well from a sense of duty as from his love of the female sex. He enumerates the experience he has had in organizing, political parties and otherwise, and intimates that he has not the slightest doubt of the success of the venture. He has already obtained the address of thousands of young women in the province and is collecting others. To these all the circular above referred to is sent, as well as a blank which candidates are expected to fill up. The information sought for in the blank is more or less of a formal character and calls for information in regard to age, color, of hair and eyes, religion, kind of temper, county wherein residing, married or single, kind of husband desired, widower or young man, any objection to children in case of widowers with families, how many feather beds, quilts, pillow-slips etc., candidate has ready, light or heavy build, number of boot worn, and other such general information which the candidate will be only too ready to supply. These blanks when filled up will be forwarded to the editor who will go through them all and classify. They are all expected to be in before the new year, and the work of classification will then be begun and finished before March 1st, when the list will be printed in classified form and great numbers of them sent up to the Northwest for distribution among the wireless men. On the first of April the premier trainload of the ladies will start for Winnipeg under the personal charge of the editor, assisted by a corps of matron ladies from all parts of Ontario. A nice clergyman will be attached to each car and a brass band will play turn about in the different coaches and at the way stations. After the boundary line has been crossed at Pembina the train will be garlanded with flowers, the editor will array himself in a robe of white satin, and with a wand in his hand he will occupy a throne of flowers built on the cow car. Frank Henry, charged with being concerned in the burglary of Mr. Shaver's store, was again remanded on yesterday in order that he might produce evidence of character.

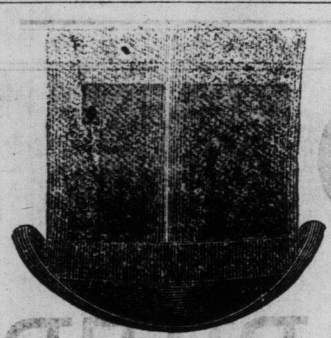

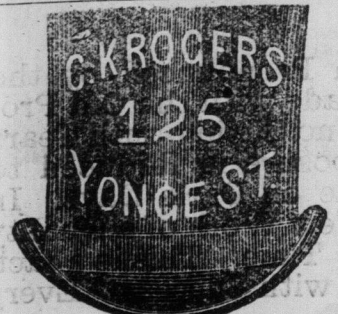
