

Brevet Major JOHN CURRIE, of the New-York Volunteers, having respectively received the public thanks of the principal Officers under whose command he has served, and of the Hon. the 21st September 1876, having distinguished himself very particularly for those services appointed Major of the King's American Regiment, vacant by the death of Major Grant.

At the Peace of 1783, Major Currie retired with his family to this Province, where he has resided ever since, and where he filled the situation of Representative to the House of Assembly, for King's—Member of Council, and Chief Magistrate of King's County, for many years.—During the last American War, he raised a Regiment, which was disbanded again in 1815.

By nature and habits industrious, and possessing talents of great extent for public business, his life has been of such advantage to those around him, who have long been in the habit of consulting him on the various subjects of business, that they have ever found him a kind though unostentatious friend.

He has left a wife and large family to lament his departure, though his advanced period of life must have long pre-occupied him for such an event.

At Elgin, N. B., on the 10th inst., at the advanced age of 107 years. This long liver died in Elgin for his infirmity. She was in the year of the rebellion 1747, servant to Lady Arradoul, who at that time presided in the house formerly belonging to the Earls of Sutherland, and lately called Balcarras, (part of the east wing of which still stands, Prince Charles Stuart, on his way of Calcutta, stopped on the various points, and the present notice is deeply and earnestly regretted by the brothers O'Brien, and all who knew him.—He has left a widow—to whom he has been united for the brief period of only four months—to mourn her sad bereavement.—*Frederick Gazette.*

REGULATIONS

For the FERRIES from the Parish of St. Andrews to the American shore.

Ordered, That there be two Ferries from St. Andrews to the American shore, the first to commence at Indian Point and terminate at the brook at Chatty's Cove. The second to commence at the said Chatty's Cove and terminate one mile above Joe's Point.

Ordered, That the person leasing the Ferry at Joe's Point shall be compelled to keep one Gondolee and two good and sufficient Bots. That the person leasing the Ferry from Indian Point to Chatty's Cove shall in like manner be compelled to keep two good and sufficient Bots at all times in readiness for the accommodation of Passengers, and subject to the inspection and instructions of the Committee appointed to superintend and regulate the same; and in the event of any improper or careless conduct on the part of the said Ferryman, any three Magistrates belonging to the Parish may deprive them of the benefits of said Ferries.

That any person or persons other than the Licensed Ferryman, conveying passengers for hire from any part of the shore within the limits above defined to any part of the American shore within one mile of Robinson town shall be liable to a penalty of twenty shillings for every passenger so carried, to be recovered by the Committee, in an action of debt before any two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County.

That Thomas Weyer, and James Rait Esqrs, be a Committee for the superintending of said Bots and Ferries.

Rates at Ferryage from Chatty's Cove to one mile above Joe's Point to the American shore.

For a man or woman, 1s 3d, children, 7 1/2d man and horse, 5s 10u horse, and chaise, Cart, or Sleigh, 6s 3d man with 2 Horses do. To 6d, every Horse, Ox, or Cow, 2s 6d. every Sheep, Calf, or Pig, 4d. if more than five Oxen, Cows, or Horses, in a drove, 1s 6d each as the ferryman from the Town of St. Andrews is not obliged to have a large Boat the ferryage be at the same rate as above except for Cattle, Horses and Chaises.
