## NEWS QF TAE WEEK.

TaE atorm of Thursday last was the noost severe one of the year. It blew a perfect lurricune the whole clay, loing an iumenso amount of damago to lifo and properly. It was partinularly severs in the neighbourhood of lichmond and Carleton Place. Sevaral housos were blown down, others unroofed, bricks from chimnies flying.through the air in all directions, and making a perfect reck of telegraph poles thereby cutuing of all intercourse with the outer world. Loud Boreas rulod supreme. It is said that at Carleton Place pules of sawn lumber were carried through tho air liks hits of paper, and one mun was seriously injureal loy a falling bourd. Another man namod Alex. McRes, while in the act cf closing thr dorp of Mr. Bycr's barn, Hichmond road. wis instantly falled by tho door being vialently swung open by the iction of tho wind strik. ing him ar fearful blow on the bend. The casuslities in and around Ottawa are too numarous to particaluise. We doubcless shall have moro of its doings when the telegraph gets azain into operation.
This jear has beca more thon unusuilly prolific in marine disasters, and its clnse is marked by the loss of the Tille de Hacre, by which tro hundred and twenty persons havo perished. The bille de Hacre, a large and lasgnificently fitted steamer, plied between New York and Brest, Al ewo o'clock on the morning of the 23 rt ot November the camo into collision with tho British ship Locke irn from Glasgov, anis sunk in ten minutes. being only time to saro eighty seven persons.

The President of the United States las presented his annual Nessage to Congress. Ho begins by referring to the financial crisis, and that the relations of the United States with other nations continue to bo friendly and cordial. Ho then relers to the settlement of tho Aalabama and other claims by the Genera and Washington conventions growing out of the lato Southern rebellion, and recommends the appointment of $a$ special court to consist of three Judgen who shall bo emporrered to hear and determino all daims of aliens upon tha United States arising out of acts committed agniast their per.
son or property during the insurrection. The next subject of importanco is that of the cap. ture of tho Virginits, by Cuban authorities, and of the settlement of the dificulty with the Spanish government; and asserts his ${ }^{4}$ conviction that the existenco of African slarery in Cuba is the principal cause of the troubleous condition of the island." Sug. gestra a better methoil of electing the Presi dent and Vice President of the nation-the establishments of Clearing Houses, and to secure at larger proportion of the Carrying Trade-the revision and collification of the Tariff laws. and the opening of more Jints for coining mones-the necessity of tho Navy being incrensed and put in a better condition for sea service-recommends the repeal of the llankrupt law so far as it provides for unvoluntary bankruptey on nceaunt of the suspension of payment. Theso constituto the princinal items shamowed forth in the Message.

Since our last, the following additional members of the Cabinct hwe been elected The EIon. Isasc Burpee, Minister of Customs; Ilon. I. J. Cartwright, Ninister of Finance.
During the investigation into the loss of the steamer Bacarian, tho ladies' maid str.ire positively that the large boat, in which was the phlot, Nis.oleon Dufour, and several Frenchmen, was rowed asvay without making the slightest attempt to save any one; also that it only took five minutes to bail out the boat, and that it mouhd have held more. She was in the boat, and the water only came over her boots. The ovilicucs of Nr. Parmenter, Toronto, was to the sime effect All the witaesses testify to the suducaness of the disaster. Communiention between the two ends of the vessel ras entirely pre vented, which added to the confusion.

It is proposed to extend the Emvince onseward to the boundry of Cuntario, which is yet un dofined, and also to the norlin and soulth for a considerable distance.
