## SALMON FISHERY.

OTTAWA, 26th May, 1876.

Tenders will be received to 15th June next for Special Licenses to use one pound or trap net with single "head" for catching salmon at each of the following fishing stations on Lake Ontario, namely:—Grafton, Colourg, Port Hope, Bowmanville, and Newcastle.

The time of fishing will be from date of License to 15th August next.

The exact place, position and extent of each net will be specified in the License.

Tenders to state the amount offered for each station separately, but not more than one License will be issued to the same holder.

Rent payable in advance on delivery of License.
