salt cod with a view to supplying the Spanish and Portuguese communities in France, or with a view to trading (re-export).

## 8.11 Monkfish

Whole frozen monkfish market, 1988:

Total imports Imported from Canada 1 259 tonnes 232 tonnes

Competing product: fresh monkfish.

Competing suppliers: United States, South Africa.

Market for frozen fillets of monkfish, 1988:

Total imports Imported from Canada 1 955 tonnes 26 tonnes

Competing product: fresh monkfish.

Competing suppliers: United States, Taiwan, South Africa.

These products are subject to a customs duty of 15%.

Buyers look for frozen monkfish tails (which are cut from imported whole fish), IQF or in 10-kg blocks, IWP, skinless or with the skin on; individual weight categories are under 1 kg, 1-2 kg, and 2 kg and over. IQF fillets, weighing about 800 grams, also find a ready market. Some buyers are interested in the possibility of supplying individual portions of a specified weight (approximately 200 grams in many instances).

These products are purchased in containerload lots.

Buyers are wholesalers, processors (prepared dishes), suppliers to corporations and institutions, and possibly freezer centres.

## 8.12 Saumonette

See Appendix 5. "Saumonette" is a commercial term denoting the flesh of various species of Squalus (spiny dogfishes) when packaged for sale to consumers.
