

Amongst the many books in the theological section which were destroyed in the fire of 1916 was a set of eight volumes of Walton's Polyglot Bible, printed in 1657. Mrs. Elizabeth Wright of Kingston was good enough to present to the Library during the past year a fine edition of this work.

During the latter part of the Recess that section of the Library which contains the literature of travels has been rearranged and the whole of the books card-indexed in respect both to subject and author.

Since our last Report the collections of Canadian pamphlets have been increased by some 94 volumes, or about 1,000 pamphlets.

This year being the sixtieth anniversary of Confederation, Vols. Nos. 1413 to 1418 inclusive, have been made up of essays relating to Confederation, published either before or since 1867. Volumes 1419 and 1420 contain pamphlets dealing with the Confederation celebration in Ottawa.
