# WEEKLY STATEMENT

Mr. Baker (Grenville-Carleton): Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. This happens to be Thursday, although it feels like Friday in Ottawa. I wonder whether the government House leader, in anticipation of the House leaders' meeting, wishes to make a statement concerning the business of the House, or would he rather leave the statement until tomorrow after the House leaders' meeting?

Mr. MacEachen: Mr. Speaker, I propose to call on Monday the bill which has been before the House for some time unless, as a result of discussions, we can make alternative arrangements. That means that today we shall continue debating the Income Tax Act, tomorrow is to be an allotted day, and on Monday, in the absence of other arrangements we shall resume debate on Bill C-19.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Speaker, with respect to the business of the House, may I put a question to the government House leader? The Minister of Veterans Affairs has said on a number of occasions that he and his department are working on the problem of prorata pensions for veterans' widows where the veteran's pension was less than 48 per cent. Can the minister say if sufficient progress has been made on that matter to lead us to expect that legislation correcting the situation will be introduced during the present session?

Mr. MacEachen: Mr. Speaker, I cannot give that undertaking at present. I am not saying it will not happen, but I cannot undertake to make it happen.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): The minister might as well go back to External Affairs.
