Hon. Francis Fox (Minister of Communications): I am informed by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation as follows:

Yes, as soon as public funds become available and (1) a suitable arrangement can be concluded with the private affiliate station which distributes the CBC English television service in New Brunswick, or (2) alternative VHF transmission capability becomes available.

PETRO-CANADA—LOANS TO EMPLOYEES

Question No. 508—Mr. Howie:

Since March 1, 1983, did Petro-Canada or its subsidiaries make any loans to its employees and, if so, in each case (a) on what date was the loan (i) made (ii) due (b) what was the (i) amount of the loan (ii) interest rate charged (iii) purpose of the loan?

Mr. Leonard Hopkins (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources): Petro-Canada reports as follows:

Petro-Canada has a housing relocation policy which enables the Corporation to offer, on a case-by-case basis, interest free loans to new and transferred employees. (a) & (b) Details regarding individual loans and their recipients cannot be released to the public because such information is considered to be of a managerial and administrative nature between Petro-Canada and the Corporation's employees.

REVENUE FROM LOTTERIES

Question No. 608—Mr. Reid (St. Catharines):

- As at January 31, 1984, how much revenue did the government receive pursuant to the 1979 federal-provincial agreement on lotteries?
- What is the anticipated return for 1984 from the agreement on lotteries?
- What monies were received in net revenue from Loto Canada on an annual basis?
- Was \$80 million in net revenue received in any one fiscal year and, if so, in which year?

Hon. Jacques Olivier (Minister of State (Fitness and Amateur Sport)): 1. Pursuant to the 1979 federal-provincial agreement on lotteries and, as of January 31, 1984, the revenue received is as follows:

2. Pursuant to the 1979 federal-provincial agreement on lotteries, the annual payment of \$24 million is indexed to the 1979 CPI. Therefore, the amount anticipated in 1984 is approximately \$35,300,000.

3. The net revenues received from Loto Canada Inc. were as follows:
