Question No. 130—**Mr. Rodriguez:**

1. From April 1, 1984 to September 17, 1984, what was the amount spent in the departmental office of the Minister for Social Development?

2. Were the budgetary guidelines exceeded and, if so, by what amount?

3. For the same period, how many exempt staff, including those on personal services contracts, were employed by the Minister and what were their names, date of appointment and salary?

There were no personal services contracts during the period of April 1, to September 17, 1984. During that period, the above exempt staff were in the employ of the Minister. It should be noted that most of these employees came with the Minister from his previous portfolio; this explains the employment dates which precede the Minister's appointment to MSSD.

RESTORATION OF THE CITADEL AT HALIFAX, N.S.

Question No. 415—**Mr. Robichaud:**

1. Did the Department of the Environment allocate funds for the restoration of the Halifax Citadel and, if so, in what amount?

2. Were such funds cut and, if so (a) which groups were consulted before a decision was taken (b) was the Minister of State (Tourism) consulted by the Minister of the Environment?

3. (a) Will funds be allocated in 1986 for completing the work (b) how many persons were working on the site before the work was stopped (c) how many persons were laid off following the budget cuts (d) will the Department replace the lost jobs?

Hon. Tom McMillan (Minister of the Environment): 1. Yes. For 1985-86, the tenth year of a \$29.4 million restoration program at the Citadel, \$5.1 million had been allocated.

2. Yes. Further expenditures were deferred on April 1, 1985. (a) Senior officials of the Department. (b) No.

3. (a) No. However, on May 3, the Minister of the Environment and The Friends of the Citadel Society signed a Memorandum of Intention to cost-share further restoration. The Department of the Environment will contribute funds in accordance with the Memorandum in 1986-87 if the Society raises \$500,000 or more. (b) 73 (49 permanent and 24 term). (c) 33 (20 permanent and 13 term). (d) Of the 20 permanent employees who were laid off, 19 have been placed in other positions in Parks Canada; nine term employees were rehired for the 1985 summer season.
