

*Portugal* relieved, *Florida* ceded, and our Disputes adjusted with *Spain*, are a reasonable and solid Equivalent for the *Havannab*.

In Return for *Martinico*, we have obtained the *French* Possessions on the left or East Bank of the *Mississippi*, and the Cession of *Grenada* with the *Grenadillas*.

The following appear to me to be the most material Variations between the Articles which miscarried in 1761, and these which have been now brought to Maturity.

In 1761, the Lakes *Huron*, *Michigan*, and *Superiour*, were to be comprehended within the Limits of *Canada*; and these Limits were to be further described and distinguished by a Line traced from the Lake *Rouge*, and taking in, by a winding Course, the River *Ouabache*, to its Junction with the *Ohio*; and from that Junction, the said Line was to continue along the *Ohio* to its Point of Confluence with the *Mississippi*: But the two Crowns were not perfectly agreed in Regard to the *Indian* Nations situated between the *British* Settlements and the *Mississippi*. — All Differences about the Boundaries and the *Indian* Nations are now happily terminated; The most extensive and the clearest Limits are given to our Possessions on the Continent of *North-America*, beyond the Reach of future Sophistry and Debate.
