General Joshua, nor to the dauntless Intrepidity of those who fought under him; but to the favourable and efficacious Interpolition of the Most High. Accordingly he declares in the Words of the Text; They got not the Land in Poffeffion by their own Sword, neither did their own arm fave them, but thy Right Hand and thy arm and the Light of thy Countenance; becaufe thou haft a Favour unto them. I am perfuaded you have already anticipated me in the Application of these Words to the glorious Train of Success and Victory over our Enemies, and to the Conquests and Acquisitions with which we have been favoured, and which we are called this Day to commemorate. SENEGAL, GOREE, GUADELUPE, LOUISBOURG. and efpecially QUEBEC, (in which Conquest, in a manner, all NORTH AMERICA is comprifed,) are Acquifitions fo valuable and important, that we cannot be deemed Friends to our Country, if our Hearts do not feel an inward Pleafure and Exultation; and I flatter myfelf I shall not be charged with defigning or attempting to damp or diminish the publick Joy, or to caft the leaft. Reflection on those gallant Men who were employed in those glorious Expeditions, if I fay, that They got not the Land in Possession by their own Sword, neither

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
