Reform in Naval Nomenclature. Lord Selborne, first lord of the British Admiralty, has decided to abandon the old practice of going to heathen mythology for names of new warships, and in future all vessels will be named after the coun-tries, counties and towns. The names of the two 18,000-ton battleships immediately to be laid down have just been announced. They are New Zealand and Hindostan. There are aiready among battleships a Dominion, a Commonwealth, a London and an Edinburgh, and it is said that the two new armored cruisers will be named Nutal and Newfoundland.
