Today's market was large. Sellers
were probably a little more plentiful
than buyers, but trade was moderately
good, and with few exceptions we
can see little change in values since
Thursday.

The price of wheat was \$1 12 as a
rule, and an occasional extra good
lot sold at \$1 13.

New oats brought 42c to 48c, and old

60c, with an extra good sample selling
now and then at 65c.

Very little of any other kind of
grain came in.

Buckwheat was nominal at 50c to
55c.

Eggs sold about 1c up all around,
and butter at the same prices.

Potatoes sold at 25c to 40c per bag.
The supply of small vegetables was
very large, squash, cabbage, celery,
and in fact all sorts were to be seen
in abundance. The prices paid were
about the same.

Fruits were steady, apples and
grapes being the chief lines offered;
grapes sold at 1c to 1-1/4c per lb.
Meats were in good supply; sales
were moderate and prices steady.

Hogs sold at \$5 to \$5 25, dressed.
Hay was steady at \$7 50 to \$8; \$2 50
to \$3 per load for straw.
