Swings Out of Repair.

The swings were not in good repair. Two of them were dangerous, and are being repaired. Mr. Gilhula said that they would be finished before Thursday, and they will then be absolutely safe.

The Trip of Inspection.

On arriving in Port Stanley, the party were met by Supt. Gilhula and Mr. Ferguson, of Ferguson & Bennett, lessees of a portion of the grounds. The station platform was first examined. It is a cinder platform, and it was thought an improvement over the old wooden platform that was there last year. It is on a level with the tracks, and is much safer when a large crowd must be handled. The train can be unloaded rapidly, and loaded almost as quickly. The complaints about the platform were filthy and ill-kept. It was raked and in good order yesterday. No refuse was found on it.

Cement Platform.

However, on rainy days, ladies in summer finery have grounds for complaint, as it certainly would be somewhat dirty. But it would dry out very rapidly, and this complaint would not be lasting. Mr. Gilhula said that the Pere Marquette would raise the platform a few inches with a covering of cement, thus insuring safety and cleanliness. This platform can be put down at small expense, and will greatly improve the condition of the depot. The work will be undertaken shortly, it was said.

When the party reached the top of the hill the grounds themselves were found in good condition, much cleaner than in years gone by. The heavy rain of a few days ago left a few water holes, but nothing in the nature of refuse was visible. The grass was not very long, and it presented a good appearance.

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Port Stanley Charges Investigated;
Hill Was Found in Excellent ShapePere Marquette and City Officials
Went Over the Place
Yesterday.

The complaints that have been made against the condition of the grounds on the Fraser Heights, Port Stanley, and the manner in which the privileges have been conducted, were investigated yesterday at the invitation of Acting Superintendent Gilhula, of the Pere Marquette, City Engineer Graydon, and Mr. A. W. White, of the London and Port Stanley Railway Board, taking in the trip. Everything was found to be in very good condition.

Mr. Hugh M. Douglass, of the Fraser House, it is alleged, made the complaints. It is said he sent a letter to City Engineer Graydon, in which he declared that the grounds were in a disgraceful condition, that the roadway leading up the hill was very dangerous, having caused one serious runaway, and that the dance hall was closed up, and no one allowed in unless they paid the musicians in charge, and that in case of a rain-storm there was no shelter for visitors; that the steps up the hill were in bad repair, and that the swings were also dangerous. Other complaints had been made to the engineer's department about the station platform and other minor details.
