# **RAISE \$250,000 FOR**

## DECLARES CHIEFS NOT AGAINST ANY POLICE "UNIONS"

Former Londoner, Who Seconded Motion, Explains Reasons.

NO CONFLICTING PULL

Obligations to Outside Unions Would Be Detrimental, Says Peterboro Police Head.

Chief of Police Thompson of Peterboro, formerly of the London police force, who seconded the resolution of the Chief Constables' Association, which so strongly disapproved the formation of labor unions among Canadian policemen, has been notified by the Trades and Labor Council of Peterboro, that the union organization will wait on him in connection with the motion he supported at the recent Hamilton convention.

According to stories appearing in the Peterboro papers, Chief Thompson has made an announcement that the purport of the resolutions was not against policemen forming unions of their own, but against what the chiefs called a questionable innovation, whereby some policemen have been induced to join trades unions. The reason for this objection by the Chief Constables' Association is based one the fear that the police could not fulfill their obligations to the municipality, in certain events, if they were affiliated with trades unions.

"The force of this contention is generally recognized," says one Peterboro paper. "The policeman's first duty is to the public, and it is demanded that there should be no conflicting obligation that might arise out of membership in a trade union.

"Chief Thompson did not dip into the details of the argument, and if the trades and labor council press their objection they will perhaps share an interesting bit of information illustrating the machinations of allen enemies and of their attempt in

"The chief stated that the alien commy question was one of the main subjects discussed at the convention, but for good reasons the full statement of facts that are known to the police chief were not made public."
