GTTAWA, July 10.—The greatest excitement since the street railway strike began prevailed today, and at certain moments it looked as if serious trouble would break out. Trouble at one of the main intersec-

Trouble at one of the main intersections of the city, during which people pulled trolleys from wires, resulted in the shutting off of electric power and the stopping of street cars shortly after 2 p.m. A number of wires fell.

One casualty has so far been reported. An elderly man named Jarvis sustaining serious injuries when knocked down by a runaway street car in observed.

Five motor cars were badly smashed at the time Jarvis was seriously injured, when a street car backed into a line of motor cars on Rideau street at 1:30 o'clock this afternoon.

The motorman intended to put on the brakes, but instead of doing this threw in the reverse with the result that the waiting motor cars were jammed. Occupants of the several cars received minor injuries while Jarvis had several ribs fractured.
