

\$1,000 DAMAGE TO GAMMAGE PROPERTY

1,100 Panes of Glass Broken by Large Hailstones.

RIVER UP TWO FEET

Belfry, Rectory Street School, Struck by Lightning in Late Afternoon Storm.

As far as is known the damage done during Friday's storm of two hours duration was comparatively slight. The greatest damage reported was that done to Gammage's greenhouse, in Knollwood Park. Some 1,100 panes of glass were broken, the loss being \$1,000. The belfry of the Rectory street school was struck by lightning, and part of the structure crashed through the roof of the school. The cornice was damaged. One hundred dollars will cover the total repairs necessary.

A large limb of a maple tree near the corner of Richmond and Oxford streets fell across the feeder wire of the London Street Railway, suspending the service in that vicinity for some time. At the corner of Queen's avenue and Adelaide streets a tree fell on the roof of a house. It was reported that the river rose two feet during the night.
