CAMDEN, N. J., Aug. 23.—Ten persons are dead and five others badly injured as the result of the grade crossing accident in this city last night. Two of the victims died early today in hospitals. A motor bus containing fifteen passengers was struck by a fast Pennsylvania electric train from Milville. The crossing has been the scene of three fatal accidents in the past six weeks.

PREMIERS AIM TO GIVE POLAND USE OF DANZIG

Giolitti and Lloyd George To Submit Their Proposals To France.

OFFICIAL STATEMENT

Conference At Lucerne Ends With Cordial Greetings To Millerand.

LUCERNE, Switzerland, Aug. 23.—Premier Lloyd George of Great Britain and Premier Giolitti of Italy have adopted proposals to be submitted to France for allied action to secure Poland free and unrestricted use of Danzig and its communications in accordance with the Versailles treaty, it was announced officially here today.

The conference between Mr. Giolitti and Signor Giolitti concluded this evening, when the premiers sent the following telegram to M. Millerand, the French foreign minister:

"In finishing our Lucerne conference we send you a cordial salute and look forward with pleasure to the earliest occasion when both of us can meet your excellency.

The official statement with regard to the proposal to the allies to give Poland freedom in the use of Danzig did not say whether diplomatic or military action was contemplated.

LARGENY ON HIGH SEAS CHARGE TO BE HEARD AT WINDSOR

Officials Perplexed by Complication of Circumstances Surrounding Case.

ALL PARTIES AMERICANS

But Crime Committed While Steamer Was in Canadian Waters.

WINDSOR, Aug. 23.—Perplexment of federal officials in Detroit lasting over four days was brought to conclusion tonight, when Frederick I. Eaton, assistant district United States attorney, advised the department of justice authorities that Alexander Morris, alias Schwarz, of Chicago, 19-year-old youth, should be handed over to the Canadian police at Windsor charged with the crime of larceny on the high seas.

The possibilities of serious international complications are involved in the peculiar case, which had its inception last Thursday at Bois Blanc Island, when Morris was placed under arrest by the captain of the steamer Columbia of the Detroit, Belle Isle and Windsor Ferry Company, when he was caught with his hand in the pocket of John Gillis of Detroit.

Caught in the Act.

The occasion was the annual outing and excursion to the down-river resort of the Scottish clans of Windsor and Detroit, and Morris was caught attempting to pick Gillis' pocket just as the crowd was leaving on the return trip. Gillis feeling a hand in his pocket seized the Chicago youth and they fought up the gangplank until the captain appeared and arrested the boy.

Then complications set in, for although Gillis, Morris and the captain of the boat are all Americans, Bois Blanc Island, under lease for 99 years by Americans, also, is inside the boundary lines of Canada. The steamer is registered in the United States.

Since the arrest the federal officials have faced the problem as to the disposition of the case until tonight, when the district attorney ruled that Morris should be turned over to the Windsor police for prosecution.

DECLARE TERMS INCOMPATIBLE WITH FREEDOM OF POLAND

LUCERNE, Aug. 23.—An official statement issued regarding the conference today between Premiers Lloyd George and Giolitti says that the premiers agreed to the vital need of the re-establishment of the peace of this peace is to be found in the various treaties already concluded.

"The victors in war," continues the statement, "should display a spirit of terms and they vanquished a spirit of loyalty in their execution. With this aim, Britain and Italy trust that a good understanding reached at Lucerne will be further developed to cover all outstanding questions."

"Before peace is fully established, however, there are a number of important questions to be decided, a majority of which are indissolubly connected with the march of events in territories of the former Russian Empire. Until peace is fully established between Russia and the rest of the world, an atmosphere of disturbance and unsettlement will continue to menace the peace of the world. Therefore, the British and Italian Governments have heard with profound regret that the Soviet Government, despite repeated assurances to the contrary given officially on their behalf in London, have sought to impose on Poland conditions incompatible with national independence."

Condition of Peace.

"For one nation to insist as a condition of peace with another that the force organized for the protection of life, property and good order to the latter country shall be drawn from only one class of its citizens, is an unwarranted infringement of the liberty, independence and self-respect of that country."

"If the Soviet Government, notwithstanding the punishment which its aggression is encountering, still refuses to withdraw this sinister proposal but continues the war inside Polish territory in order to force its acceptance upon the Polish people no free government can either acknowledge or deal with the Soviet oligarchy."

To Teach Wisdom.

"What has happened in this short war to the invaders of national rights, whether in Russia or in Poland, ought to teach wisdom to aggressors. The world, east and west, is crying for peace, but peace is only obtainable on the basis of full recognition of the liberties of nations."

"The British and Italian Governments are alarmed at the indefinite prolongation of the present state of conflict amongst nations. The peoples engaged in these antagonisms can bring nothing but ever increasing misery to the peoples of the world at large, for they involve continued unrest, and weakened by five years of incessant warfare, is menaced by the prospect. The British and Italian Governments therefore are united in urging that every effort should be made to bring to conclusion the existing conditions of strife between nations."

Strike Oil Within Arctic Circle on Mackenzie River

TORONTO, Aug. 23.—Oil has been struck by the Imperial Oil Company, limited, at a point just within the Arctic Circle, north of the Great Slave Lake, and close to the Mackenzie River, according to an announcement made today. The flow of oil is small and possibly cannot be made use of economically, but it is regarded as significant that a day has been found there. The flow is ten barrels a day. Much more hopeful enterprises are being carried on at other points, and good results are expected at Czar, Alberta, where the company's wells are already 2,000 feet down. It is expected that oil will be found in another 500 feet of boring.

KINGSTON LEAGUE IN PROTEST TO LL. GEORGE

KINGSTON, Aug. 23.—The Kingston branch of the Self-Determination For Ireland League of Canada passed a resolution of thanks to Premier Lloyd George for the material aid his arrest and detention of Archbishop Mannix has given the Irish people in their fight for the right to choose freely their own form of government, and their relations with other nations and peoples, without coercion or dictation from outside."

At the same time they protested against the unwarranted interference with the liberties of an Australian subject, arrested and detained without even the semblance of a trial.

A copy of the resolution has been cabled to Archbishop Mannix.

PROMINENT BOTANIST DEAD AT TORONTO

TORONTO, Aug. 23.—William James Wilson, prominent Canadian scientist, died here Saturday afternoon after a prolonged illness. Since the death of Prof. Penhallow of McGill University, some nine years ago, Mr. Wilson was regarded to be the leading botanist in the country, and his findings and explorations obtained for him a niche for all time in the history of Canadian botany.

LAST CHECKS FOR PENSIONS UNDER OLD SCALE BEING ISSUED

OTTAWA, Aug. 23.—(Canadian Press)—The last pensions checks before the coming into effect of the new scale are now being issued. These are the August pension checks, which have been going out from the pensions board offices here since August 10. The September checks will carry the increases recommended by the special parliamentary committee, and which were the basis of amendments to the pensions act made during the last session. Canada's pension bill for the twelve months ending August 31, this year, will be, it is estimated, the neighborhood of \$25,000,000. With the increases going into effect on September 1, of this year, it is estimated that the pensions bill for the next twelve months will be increased by \$10,000,000, and the total will be \$35,000,000. This is exclusive of the payments necessary through the commutation of pensions, as provided for in the amendments to the act.
