Lasker and Capablanca Play Their Third Draw

Havana, March 20.—The third game of the world's championship chess match between Dr. Emanuel Lasker and Jose Capablanca was adjourned at 1 o'clock this morning after thirty-one moves had been completed by each player without any apparent advantage on the part of either. Play was resumed tonight.

At midnight it became apparent that the game could not be finished by 1 a.m. and that another sitting would be necessary to conclude the second half of the third game. Queens were exchanged shortly afterwards. A few additional moves were made, and time was called when thirty-one moves had been registered. Capablanca asked his move. Only ten minutes was occupied by the first thirteen moves, no novel plays being made. With his move Dr. Lasker became more aggressive in his endeavor, he said, to avoid, if possible, another side calculation. It is possible that Lasker should have got home first.
