THE PHILOSOPHER'S SCALES.

A WORK, when his critics succeeded were o'er,
In the depths of his cell with its stone-covered door,
Recalling to thought his alchemical brain.
He found'd the contrivance we now shall explain:
Is Youth' trial protracted, but years stole away;
And ere 'twas complete he was wrinkled and grey;
But success in scenes, unless misery fail'd.
And at length he produced the *Philosopher's Scales*,
What were they? you ask;—you shall presently see;
These scales were not made to weigh sugar and tea;
Or—nor for such properties wondrous had they,
These qualities, feelings and thoughts that could weigh
Two other with article small or vast;
From mountains or planets to atoms of sense;
Nought, was there so bulky, but there it could lay,
And nought so slender, but there it would stay,
And nought so redundant, but in it must go—
All which some exemplum more clearly will show.
The first thing he weigh'd was the head of *Voltaire*,
Which retained all the wit that had ever been there;
As a weight he threw in a torn scrap of a leaf,
Containing the prayer of the Penitent Thief;
When the scull rose aloft with a sudden a rebuff,
That it bounced like a ball on the end of the coil.
One time he put in *Alexander the Great*,
With a garment that *Darius* had made, for a weight,
And the clad in armour from sandals to crown;
The helmet rose up, and the garment went down.
A long row of Atoms—house, simply endowed,
By a well exercised *Charter*, bay and broad,
Next loaded one scales, while the other was press'd
By blow into the floor;—now dropt into the chest—
Up flew the emblem, not swaying an ounce,
And down down the *Philosopher's world* came with a bounce.
Again he performed an experiment rare—
A work, with amazement bleeding and bare,
Climbed into his scale,—in the other was laid
The heart of a *Hound*, now partly decayed—
When he found with surprise that the heart of his brother
Weigh'd less by some pounds, than the *lit* of the other.
By further experiments, (no matter how)
He found that ten chariot's weigh'd less than an oxen;
A sword, with gilt trapping, rose up with the scale,
Though balanced by only a ten-penny nail;
A shield and a helmet, a buckler and spear,
Weigh'd less than a widow's unburialized tear;
A Lord and a Lady went up at full sail,
When a Bee chanced to light on the opposite scale;
Ten Doctors, ten Lawyers, two Couriers, one Earl,
Ten Collector's Wigs, full of powder and curl,
All heaped in one balance, and swinging from thence,
Weigh'd less than a few grains of canary sand-and-sens;
A first water diamond, with brilliants begirt,
Than one good potle, just washed from the dirt;
Yet no mountain of silver and gold would suffice,
One pearl to outweigh—was the pearl of great price!
Last of all, the whole world was bowld in at the gate,
With the soul of a beggar to serve for a weight;
When the former sprung up with so strong a rebuff,
That it smote a vast rent, and escaped at the roof—
When balanced in air, it ascended on high,
And sailed up aloft a balloon in the sky—
While the scale with the soul in, so lightly failed,
That it jerked the *Philosopher* out of his cell.
