STEAMSHIP SUNK;

FIVE OF CREW KILED

New York, April 3—The British steamer Stanley, of 3,987 tons gross, from Newport News, March 7, with a cargo of grain for Cherbourg, was sunk by a German submarine without warning, on March 21, and five members of her crew were killed. Fifteen survivors of the ship reached here today on the steamer Port Albany. Two other members of the crew, one an American, died of exposure in open boats.

Two boats were lowered when the Stanley was hit. The one containing the captain and eighteen men drifted away from the boat which contained the men picked up by the Port Albany and has not been heard of since.


