



with Mosquitos The following is an extract from a letter recently received from the wife of an army officer in India:—
"Our home was simply swarming with millions of mosquitoes last hot weather, and after burning a handful, or tin, of the powder on an open stove and shutting up the entire room, thousands literally fell down on the floors and tables. In the drawing room alone we had a white felt rug which became black in a few hours, the insects by hundreds laying dead on it."
