SAN AMBROSIA DENIED BY QUAKE AND POISON GAS

American Geologist Confirms Reports of Havoc Wrought in November Uplift.

Valparaiso, Chile, May 18.—A scientific expedition headed by the American geologist, Bailey Willis, has just returned from the islands of San Ambrosia and San Felix, 300 miles west of Chanaan, having verified the conditions reported by Captain Campbell of the steamship Marlin, in March, when he encountered a great tidal wave and evidences of the havoc wrought by the November earthquake and subsequent shocks there.
