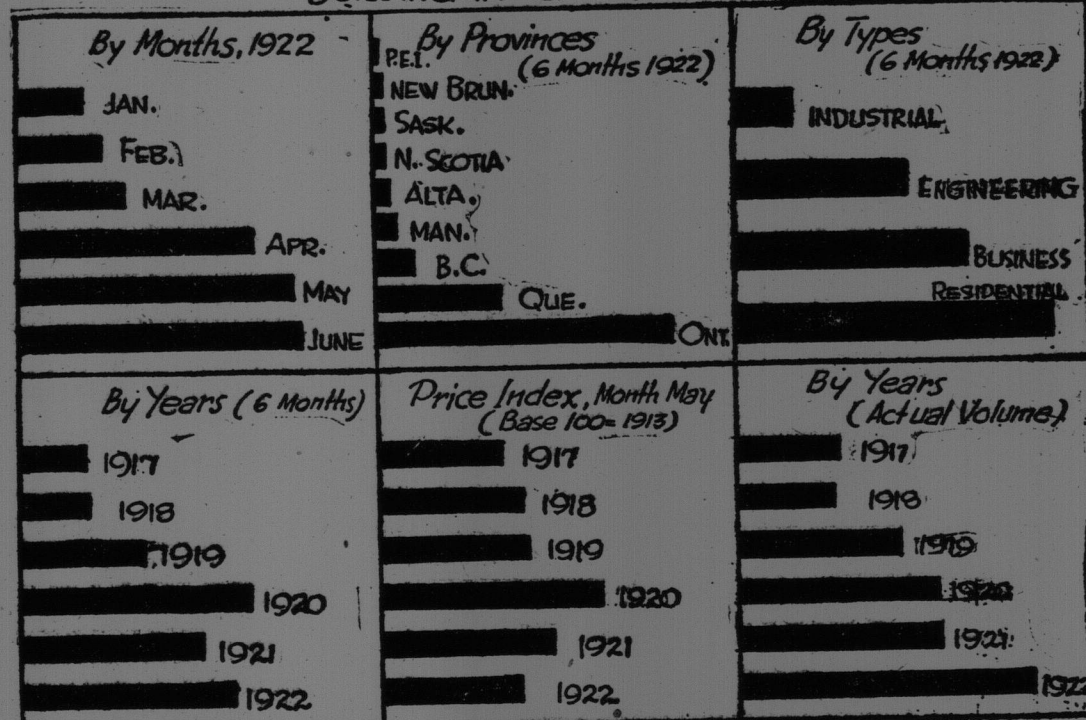

No Pause In Growth of Canadian Building

1922 Half Yearly Total Sets New Record in Actual Volume of Work Performed—Solving the Housing Problem.

BUILDING IN CANADA



(MacLean Building Reports, Ltd., 845 Adelaide street West, Toronto)

One of the most encouraging features—and there are many of them—in Canadian building statistics for the first half of 1922, is the steady expansion which has occurred, month by month, in the value of work performed. Starting with the small total of \$8,992,000 in contracts awarded during January, the figures compiled by MacLean Building Reports Limited show a swiftly rising tide, which culminates in the \$35,620,400 record for June, the latest month under review. The progress of the industry may be set forth as follows:

January.....	\$8,992,000
February.....	10,718,200
March.....	13,468,000
April.....	29,428,400
May.....	34,837,800
June.....	35,620,400

Analysing this table on the basis of locality, it appears that Ontario leads conspicuously, accounting as it does for more than 56 per cent.
