**TO HARNESS ICELAND'S WATERFALLS**  
(The Engineering and Mining Journal.)  
From a Norwegian source we learn that a combine of German nitrate interests, headed by the Badische Anilin- und Soda-Fabrik, has been arranged to keep out competitors, and that the Germans have secured a method of production, which, unlike that of Norway or Sweden, is entirely independent of electric energy. Works will be erected for an output of from 30,000 to 60,000 tons annually. The Norwegian annual output is 80,000 tons. The engineers of the Nitrogen Products & Carbide Co. have recently completed their survey of the Dettifoss falls in Iceland, where it is the intention of the company to supplement the Gulla output in Norway—though on a much larger scale. The Dettifoss falls is about 410,000 h. p.



## A MARRIAGE CASE

Tremblay-Despatis Matter Before Privy Council

SENT OVER FROM MONTREAL

Has to do With Annulment of Marriage of Fourth Cousins Who Wed Without Knowing of Their Kinship

London, May 7.—An appeal of considerable interest to Canadians was heard by the Privy Council this week. Navina Despatis, otherwise Mrs. Napoleon Tremblay, appeared from a decision of the court of review sitting in Montreal confirming a judgment rendered by Mr. Justice Brien of the District of Quebec, who granted her husband, Napoleon Tremblay, a declaration that his marriage was null and non-existent. They had been married in 1904.

The facts are not disputed. Both are Catholics and when they married in 1904 neither knew that they were cousins in the fourth degree, and no ecclesiastical dispensation was applied for. Six years later the husband ascertained his relationship and applied to his bishop under the rule of the Council of Lateran for a decree of nullity. This was granted.

The argument for the wife rested largely on Article 127 of the civil code, but it is further contended that the code provided for no declaration of nullity of a marriage because of the existence of ecclesiastical impediments, also that even under the rule of the Council of Lateran the impediment in cases such as the present was not an absolute one, as it had been the usual practice to grant dispensations.

In any event, it was further argued on behalf of Mrs. Tremblay, if the marriage was actually solemnized it could not be annulled. Any penalties in connection with it could only be ecclesiastical penalties.

Reference is also made to a statute of Henry VIII. which declared null all impediments except those mentioned. Lord Parker, who presided, said that God's law shall not render any marriage impeachable within the king's realm, or any of His Grace's other lands and dominions.

Arnold Wainwright, of Montreal, who is counsel for Mrs. Tremblay, informed their Lordships that the case was the first of the kind in Canadian jurisprudence. Another case was pending regarding the impediments recognized by the Jewish persuasion.

**Civil Marriage Aspect**  
Lord Moulton asked was there no clause saying marriage was a civil contract and Mr. Wainwright replied that before the code was established the only people who kept marriage registers were ministers of religion, but he contended they did so only as civil servants.

Lord Parker: "What about mixed marriages before the Napoleonic decrees?" Mr. St. Germain, K. C., (counsel for Mr. Tremblay) "Before the decrees such a marriage was valid but was illicit." The case was adjourned.

## ELECTRIC CLOTHES



the heating apparatus rusted and was ruined.

Ultimately, however, another French scientist, Dr. P. Despatis, of Bordeaux, took up the experiments and it is said has at last succeeded in producing suits made from electrically-wired fabrics which meet all practical tests. The wiring is woven into the cloth so that only an expert would know it was there. It does not in the least affect the appearance of the fabric, or its suppleness and wearing qualities. The metal used is an alloy and the construction is such that a short-circuit with the consequent shock or burn to the wearer is practically impossible.

One of these electric suits can be connected with any electric current of any voltage just as you do an electric iron or fan or lamp. Storage batteries carried in the pockets will be sufficient to keep the suits heated for short periods, and automobilists can make connection with powerful batteries in their cars when they feel the air is too cold.

The value of such an invention is obvious. However heavy the clothes they put on, they do not produce heat. All they can do is to keep a small percentage of the tremendous amount of heat which every healthy body is continually gathering. We are forever taking off our coats and putting them on because we are too hot or too cold—and most of us are forever "taking cold" as a result of these unsatisfactory methods of keeping our bodies at the proper temperature.

Electrically-heated garments, however, remove all these difficulties. Clothed in them, a man or woman, the moment they feel the slightest chill, have only to press a button, and, like magic, they will be warm from the tips of the toes to the top of the head, and as comfortable out of doors in the severest weather as they would be by their own fire-side.


