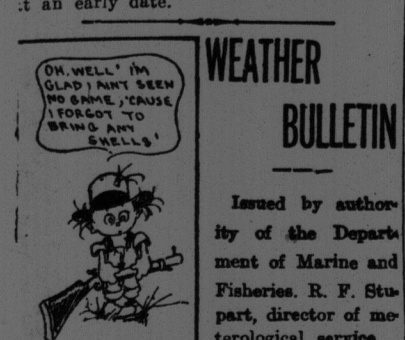
NEED BIGGER PLATFORM
